## What are Community Sharps?

Community Sharps are medical devices that penetrate the skin and are used in the home or outside formal medical services. such as hospitals.

#### They include:

**Syringes** 



Pen needles





Lancets (finger prickers)



Insulin pump infusion set cannula insertion needles



Libre Flash Freestyle Monitor equipment



# How do I dispose of my **Community Sharps?**

Place Sharps in an appropriate container. Dispose of containers only into Community Sharps disposal facilities at:

- Public hospitals
- Participating pharmacies
- Community Sharps disposal bins

Safe disposal of Community Sharps reduces the risk of harm to others and the environment
